## BACK TO CHURCH GUIDELINES

At this time, we are **only** using the West Entrance.

### IMPORTANT: Diocesan Covid Updates and guidelines:

- 1. Except for worship services, our diocesan protocols require proof of vaccination be shown on entry to church property.** The proof must be shown each time someone enters.
- 2. We require that every eligible person be double-vaccinated before they can greet, sing in a church choir, administer communion, serve refreshments, or engage in other activities related to worship.**
- 3. All who attend in-person worship are required to wear a mask at all times,** including the preacher, readers, and singers. If you don't have a mask, you can get one at the greeting table.
- 4. Please sign in and keep a 2 meter distance from others not in your household.**
- 5. The collection plate will be at the back of the church. Please place your donations in the plate as you enter.**
- 6. The Common Cup at Holy Communion** has been re-introduced. If you are not comfortable receiving the cup at this time, reception in one kind (either the bread only, or the wine only) is considered full Communion. Intinction (dipping the bread in the wine) is not permitted.
- 7. Congregational singing** is permitted. Physical distancing and mask wearing are essential.
- 8. Social time:** suspending the serving of refreshments (any beverages or food) during church social gatherings.

**Michelle Good to deliver 125th Anniversary lecture on Dec. 6, 2021.**

Michelle Good is a Cree writer and a member of the Red Pheasant Cree Nation in Saskatchewan. After working for Indigenous organizations for twenty-five years, she obtained a law degree and advocated for residential school survivors for over fourteen years. In addition to winning the 2020 Governor General's Award for fiction, *Five Little Indians*, her first novel won the HarperCollins/UBC Best New Fiction Prize, the Writers Trust Fiction Prize and the 2021 Amazon Canada First Novel Award.

**First Reading:** *Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14:* As I watched, thrones were set in place, and an Ancient One took his throne, his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames, and its wheels were burning fire. A stream of fire issued and flowed out from his presence. A thousand thousands served him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood attending him. The court sat in judgment, and the books were opened. As I watched in the night visions, I saw one like a human being coming with the clouds of heaven. And he came to the Ancient One and was presented before him. To him was given dominion and glory and kingship, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him. To him who loves us and freed us from our sins by his blood, and made us to be a kingdom, priests serving his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen. Look! He is coming with the clouds; every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and on his account all the tribes of the earth will wail. So it is to be. Amen. "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.

**Gospel:** *John 18:33-37:* Pilate then went back inside the palace, summoned Jesus and asked him, "Are you the king of the Jews?" "Is that your own idea," Jesus asked, "or did others talk to you about me?" "Am I a Jew?" Pilate replied. "Your own people and chief priests handed you over to me. What is it you have done?" Jesus said, "My kingdom is not of this world. If it were, my servants would fight to prevent my arrest by the Jewish leaders. But now my kingdom is from another place."
